Northern Lights RM Called to Florida

Florida Disciples have called Rev. Sandy Messick as their next Regional Minister. She will begin her new duties in July 2022. Sandy has served as Regional Minister in our neighboring Disciples regional church since 2009. In 2009, she accepted a call to serve as the Regional Minister for the Northwest Region. In 2020, Disciples in the Northwest Region and in the Montana Region joined together to create the Northern Lights Region.

The Northern Lights regional church celebrated Rev. Messick's ministry and introduced a Regional Minister Search Committee at their Regional Assembly on May 21. Rev. Dr. La Taunya Bynum, Regional Minister of the Northern California/Nevada region, will advise the committee. The Northern Lights regional search process will begin with a series of Zoom conversations to hear from as many Disciples in the region as possible. An Interim Regional Minister will serve while the Search Committee does its work. Prayers lifted for our neighbors.

Claremont School of Theology Revises Plans for Salem Campus

Claremont School of Theology (CST) has decided not to relocate to the Willamette University campus in Salem, OR. CST has announced plans to continue with its main campus location in California, with the Willamette location becoming a branch campus site. Unforeseen legal problems prevented the seminary from making a complete move to Oregon.

In recent years, several CST students from this region have completed their Master of Divinity degrees. At the 2022 Regional Assembly, Rev. Dr. Belva Brown Jordan, Interim President of the Disciples Seminary Foundation, recognized two students, Geonyul Byeon and Chuck Varner, who graduated in May 2022. Other graduates in recent years include Giuseppe Amato, Rob Tulloch and Billy Strehlow. Future Oregon SW Idaho seminary students will have the option of hybrid studies through CST, at Phillips Theological Seminary (in Tulsa, OK) or at Lexington Theological (KY).

IRS Raises Auto Reimbursement Effective July 1

The Internal Revenue Service has changed the standard mileage reimbursement rate starting on July 1, 2022. To reflect the rising cost of gas, the rate will increase to \$.625 per mile. Pastors often receive a per mile reimbursement

from congregations for ministry related driving in their personal cars.
